

VACCINATION CLINICS

COVID-19 vaccination clinics continue at the locations and times below. Bring a photo ID. Those due for their second dose are reminded to bring their COVID-19 immunization card.

Minors must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and provide government -issued identification to validate age. Minor's birth certificate is acceptable. Parent/legal guardian must have a government-issued ID. Guardians must also present legal guardianship or power-of-attorney document.



COUNTRY ARRIVAL PROTOCOLS

NEW INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL POLICY

New policy requiring foreign nationals (non-U.S. citizens who are nonimmigrants) traveling to the US by air to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 took effect November 8, 12:01am EST

- FDA approved and authorized vaccines, and vaccines that have an Emergency Use Listing (EUL) from the WHO will be accepted for air travel (Janssen/J&J, Pfizer-BioNtech, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Covishield, BIBP/Sinopharm, & Sinovac)
- Vaccinated inbound travelers, including US citizens, must also show proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken no more than three days before departure to travel to the US from abroad
 - Unvaccinated Americans abroad will need a negative COVID-19 test within a day of return flight
- CDC considers full vaccination possible with mixed doses, so long as they are approved either by the FDA or WHO
- Limited exemptions are given for unvaccinated such as children under 18 years of age and persons on diplomatic or official foreign government travel (click link below for complete exemption list)

TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS BY MARKET



JAPAN

- Only Japanese nationals and foreign nationals with valid status of residence are allowed to enter Japan
- Japanese government does not distinguish between vaccinated and unvaccinated travelers for entry requirements
- All arrivals, regardless of nationality are subject to 14-day quarantine
- Secure negative certificate 72 hours prior to departure; airline to verify; test again *upon arrival*
- Download 3 apps on smartphone* (MySOS, Google Maps and COCOA)
* *Traveler will be required to rent a smartphone if they do not own one*
- For Japanese nationals who have negative result in both tests, requested to 14-days home self-quarantine

SOUTH KOREA

- All travelers to South Korea must provide proof of a negative PCR test result collected within 72 hours of their departure
- As of May 5, those fully vaccinated in South Korea can bypass quarantine; As of Aug 30, PCR test required on Day 1 and Day 6/7 of arrival
- Those not fully vaccinated in Korea must undergo 14-day home quarantine; PCR tests required on day 1 and day 12/13 of arrival.
- Korean nationals arriving without a negative PCR test will be required to undergo a 7-day quarantine at a government facility at their expense (\$120/day), followed by 7 days of home quarantine.
- Foreigners arriving without a negative PCR test will be denied entry.
- Children under the age of 6 may be exempted from the negative PCR test result requirement and quarantine if all of the accompanying persons traveling with children have vaccinated and submitted valid negative PCR test results.
- Korean resident who receives their first dose in Korea and receives their second dose on Guam are able to bypass quarantine upon arrival in Korea if they register and get 2nd dose of vaccination certificate from the local public health center in Korea. (if no registration/issuance, no quarantine exemption)

TAIWAN

- Requires a negative PCR test 72 hours prior to departure
- Fill out electronic health declaration form prior to departure via Quarantine System for Entry @ <https://hdhq.mohw.gov.tw>
- Travelers are required to make an affidavit stating that the location of their intended **14-day quarantine** in Taiwan meets relevant regulations
- All travelers will be quarantined for 14 days with the following exceptions: Taiwan tourists who participate in the Palau Travel Corridor program only need 5 days enforcement self-health monitoring + 9 days self-health monitoring (individual is not allow to take any public transportations in this period)

PHILIPPINES

- All nationals/Filipinos, including spouse and children (Filipino/foreign), foreign crew members, foreign government and international organization officials accredited to the Philippines and foreign nationals allowed under relevant IATF resolutions are permitted entry to the Philippines
- Undertake COVID-19 testing at the quarantine hotel/facility on day 5 or 7 from arrival, depending on vaccination status
- Be within the max capacity of inbound passengers
- Have a pre-booked accommodation for at least six or eight nights in an accredited quarantine hotel/facility, depending on vaccination status







JAPAN COVID-19 NEWS

NATIONWIDE

- The number of new cases of infection nationwide has continuously decreased and it is approximately below 1 per 100,000 population for the past week.
- New cases nationwide have been below 500 for 22 consecutive days since Oct 17.

VACCINATION

- 92 million people (73%) are fully vaccinated and 2nd does for all individuals seem to be completed this month.
- 91% of 65+ senior citizens were fully vaccinated.
- Full vaccination rate for over 50+ population exceeded 83%.
- MHLW aims to use the oral treatment Lagevrio (molunpiravir) approved in the UK in Japan by the end of the year.








Japan Vaccination Certificate



TAIWAN HOSPITAL TO BEGIN CLINICAL TRIALS ON VACCINE BOOSTER SHOT

- Taiwan's Chang Gung Memorial Hospital aims to begin clinical trials in two weeks to determine which brand of COVID-19 vaccine to use in booster shots, a hospital official said Saturday.
- The hospital recently received approval from the Ministry of Health and Welfare to conduct the trials, which will see people fully vaccinated with the AstraZeneca (AZ) COVID-19 vaccine receive a booster shot from a different brand, according to Chiu Cheng-hsun, who leads the hospital's vaccination team.
- The hospital plans to recruit 400 people for the trials, and are focusing on frontline medical workers and airline crew, because these two groups are at higher risk of contracting the disease, Chiu said at an event marking Nov. 12's Doctor's Day in Taipei.
- Frontline medical workers and airline crew were also among the first groups to be fully vaccinated with AZ, the only COVID-19 vaccine in use when Taiwan's vaccination program began on March 22. A second brand, Moderna, was included in the rollout from June 9.

- On November 3, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) announced that it will temporarily suspend its use of the key high-risk country list that includes countries in this list mainly because of the Delta variant, and that the quarantine measures applicable to arrivals from areas under Level 3 travel notice will apply to arrivals from India, the UK, and Myanmar starting 00:00 on November 6 (time of arrival in Taiwan).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS BARRED FROM ENTRY

Non-resident international students will be banned from entering Taiwan between Dec. 15 and Feb. 11, with the Ministry of Education (MOE) urging those wishing to enter for the fall semester to do so on or before Dec. 14.

The temporary restrictions, which only apply to those students who do not already possess an Alien Residency Certificate (ARC), are being introduced due to concerns over quarantine space around the Lunar New Year holiday.

Students without a valid ARC wishing to enter after Dec. 15 must submit an application through their school to the MOE that outlines the reasons for the late entry, why substitute learning arrangements are insufficient, as well as details of quarantine plans.

The application will then be passed on to the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC), who will grant approvals depending on the amount of quarantine space available, the MOE said.



TAIWAN TAKES DELIVERY OF NEW BATCH OF PFIZER-BIONTECH VACCINE

- Taiwan on Friday received a new shipment of the Pfizer-BioNTech (BNT) COVID-19 vaccine, comprising 871,700 doses, from the manufacturer in Germany.



- According to the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC), it was the 11th delivery of the vaccine Taiwan has received.

- The expiration date of the batch of doses is March 3, 2022, the CECC said.
- The shipment arrived at 6:20 a.m. at Taoyuan International Airport on China Airlines flight CI-62, which took off from Germany's Frankfurt Airport Thursday.

TAIWAN SEEKING TO PRODUCE COVID-19 VACCINE FOR MODERNA: MINISTER

- Taiwan is sparing no effort to pursue a deal with Moderna Inc. to manufacture its COVID-19 vaccine, Minister of Health and Welfare Chen Shih-chung said Wednesday, while admitting that goal could be hard to achieve.
- "We have a good relationship with the United States at present, and since there is mutual trust, of course we hope to be involved in frontend manufacturing (of the Moderna vaccine)," Chen said during a legislative session, when asked by an opposition lawmaker if Taiwan is vying for backend or frontend production of the Moderna vaccine.
- Backend production refers to processes such as filling vials with the vaccine, and labeling, sealing, and packaging of vaccines, while frontend production refers to the actual production of the vaccine ingredients.
- When pressed further on the possibility of Taiwan striking a deal with Moderna to manufacture its vaccine, Chen said only that "the U.S. is very protective of its mRNA vaccine technology."



TAIWAN DROPS ALL COUNTRIES FROM HIGH-RISK LIST

- Taiwan on Wednesday (Nov. 3) removed the remaining three countries from its high-risk list, meaning all arrivals will now have more options on quarantine locations but must shoulder the cost themselves.
- The Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) said following the removal, all visitors arriving in Taiwan will be required to stay at either a designated hotel or centralized quarantine center for their 14-day isolation. The measure takes effect Saturday (Nov. 6).
- Previously, passengers from high-risk countries were required to quarantine at centralized facilities, which the government paid for.

TAIWAN'S INABILITY TO REACH 80% VACCINATION RATE MEANS CLOSED BORDERS FOR REST OF YEAR

The head of the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) on Monday (Nov. 8) said that it will be difficult for 80% of the population to be vaccinated by the end of the year, making the opening of its borders this year unlikely.



Taiwan's first-dose vaccine coverage currently stands at 74.6%, while 37.55% of the population has received two doses. Experts generally believe that 80% of the population should be fully vaccinated before the country opens its borders to international travelers.

According to CECC statistics, from Nov. 6-7, 177,334 doses were administered in Taiwan, including 80,437 AstraZeneca doses, 16,662 Moderna doses, 1,251 Medigen doses, and 78,984 Pfizer-BioNTech doses.

Thus far, 26,281,921 doses have been administered, including 12,942,159 AstraZeneca doses, 6,368,824 Moderna doses, 1,433,110 Medigen doses, and 5,568,627 Pfizer-BioNTech doses.



TAIWAN TO REOPEN ADULT ENTERTAINMENT SECTOR, EXTEND COVID-19 ALERT

As the domestic COVID-19 pandemic situation improves, Taiwan will allow licensed entertainment venues that include hostess services to resume operations, beginning Nov. 16, but the current COVID-19 Level 2 alert will be extended to Nov. 29, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) said Thursday.

Licensed adult entertainment venues, such as nightclubs, disco halls, pubs, hostess clubs and massage parlors, with hosts or hostesses, will be conditionally allowed to open from Nov. 16, Health Minister Chen Shih-chung, said at a daily CECC news briefing.

However, employees of such entertainment venues will be required to have received at least one shot of a COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days before and provide a negative rapid antigen or PCR test result taken within the three days before starting work, according to Chen.



TAIWAN ANNOUNCES NEW '7+7' QUARANTINE RULES

The Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) on Thursday (Nov. 11) confirmed that the mandatory quarantine in epidemic prevention hotels for people who are fully vaccinated will be reduced to seven days during the Lunar New Year, and it announced the details of the new scheme.

Health Minister and CECC head Chen Shih-chung said that in anticipation of a massive influx of overseas Taiwanese during the Lunar New Year holiday, the new "7 plus 7" measures will be in effect from Dec. 14 to Feb. 14. Under this program, those who have received the second dose of a COVID vaccine at least 14 days prior to arrival will be able to reduce their hotel quarantine to seven days during the holiday, while the remaining seven days can then be spent at their place of residence.

Those wishing to apply for the shortened hotel quarantine must provide proof that they have been fully inoculated with a vaccine recognized by the WHO or the Taiwanese government. They must also undergo PCR testing before they board their flight to Taiwan and upon arrival.





DOH NOW CONSIDERING MANDATORY VACCINATION

Health Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire said the country may have to implement mandatory vaccination to achieve herd immunity against COVID-19.

The health official was reacting to remarks earlier by Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr., chief implementer of the National Task Force Against COVID-19 (NTF), who said a vaccine mandate in the form of an executive order may be necessary to ensure protection of inoculated families.

“Now [this is] one of the things we are looking at because we will never achieve the immunity needed by our population if there are still sectors of society that remain unvaccinated,” Vergeire said.

“One of the ways we can do this is to make it mandatory,” she said during a press briefing.

This was a departure from her statement in April when she said that it was “the right of a person to decide on his own if he shall receive or will not receive the vaccine,” citing “principles that we adhere to” and the recommendation of the World Health Organization (WHO) that vaccination should be voluntary.

But she also said that people had the “moral obligation” to protect themselves, their families and communities, and the “whole population” against COVID-19. Vergeire added, however, that vaccination could not yet be mandated because the vaccines then were at the “developmental stage.”

IATF TO RE-EXAMINE TOURISM POLICY, QUARANTINE FOR THOSE RETURNING TO PH

The Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) on COVID-19 will re-evaluate the shorter quarantine period for those entering the country.

In the Senate plenary debate for the 2022 national budget, Senator Ralph Recto slammed IATF policy. “What is the policy concerning the quarantine when you enter the Philippines? Let’s say the United States—and most of the people there are vaccinated—if you have a vaccine, PCR test, and you come to the Philippines, are you still required to quarantine?” said Recto.

Senator Sonny Angara, who is defending the proposal, replied that they do not need to be quarantined if they come from a country on the green list. “If you come from a country on the green list, you don’t have to be quarantined. If you are on the yellow country list, which includes the US, you quarantine for five days, and if you test negative, you can go home. But if you test positive, you have to go to a facility-based quarantine,” he said.

Recto added that the policy needs to be looked at carefully because it will help a lot for the economy, especially if it is open to tourists. Angara agreed to Recto’s suggestion and said the IATF would meet again. IATF to re-examine tourism policy, quarantine for those returning to PH.

“Secretary Galvez has assured us that they’re going to discuss it, and they’re going to merge the green and the yellow so that they could have less quarantine and attract more foreign tourists,” he said.

DOH APPROVES GUIDELINES FOR BOOSTER AND ADDITIONAL COVID-19 VACCINES

Health Secretary Francisco Duque III has approved the recommendation of an independent panel to give COVID-19 booster shots and additional vaccine doses, but the required documents and guidelines must be finalized before the program can launch.

The recommendation of the Health Technology Assessment Council (HTAC) includes giving booster shots for healthcare workers and senior citizens six months after they complete the single- or two-dose COVID-19 vaccine, while immunocompromised patients are recommended to get additional shots at least 28 days after they complete their vaccination.



DOH stressed that an amended emergency use authorization from the Food and Drug Administration is required before the rollout of the booster and additional shots. The application and initial documents have been submitted to the drug regulatory agency, but DOH is finalizing the list of brands to apply for.

After the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) makes a decision, it is forwarded to President Rodrigo Duterte, who will have the final say in the national vaccination policy.

PHILIPPINES EYES VACCINATING 15 MILLION PEOPLE AGAINST COVID-19 IN 3-DAY DRIVE

The Philippine Government aims to vaccinate some 15 million residents in a nationwide 3-day COVID-19 vaccination program around the end of November. The "Bayanihan, Bakunahan" program targeted for November 29 to December 1 will tap up to 5,000 inoculation sites, including government buildings, schools, arenas, and private facilities like malls and fast food restaurants, said vaccine "czar" Carlito Galvez Jr.



The program will involve societies and government agencies with the objective of mobilizing all stakeholders, people, and logistics to reach the 15 million goal. This is also a way for the government to help areas whose vaccination drives are slightly weak because of challenges and logistical limitations.

WHO, GOVERNMENT SEEK EXPANSION OF VACCINE COVERAGE AMONG ELDERLY IN PH

The Philippine Government aims to hike the COVID-19 vaccination coverage for the elderly this month according to Vaccine czar Carlito Galvez amid a similar call from the World Health Organization (WHO) to focus on the sector. During the month of November, the government will push for 70% vaccination of its elderly population. Thus far, about 59% of this age group is vaccinated. Health officials are calling for local government units to ramp up the vaccine distribution in the regions to protect the most vulnerable groups as quickly as possible so that the economy can be reopened in a sustainable manner. The government seeks to inoculate at least 54 million Filipinos by year end.
