DPHSS Guidance Memo 2020-11 Rev8

RE: Additional Guidance Relative to Executive Order Nos. 2020-04, 2020-11, 2020-14, 2020-16, 2020-20, 2020-22, 2020-24, 2020-27, 2020-28, 2020-29, 2020-30, 2020-31, 2020-32, and 2020-33

The purpose of this Guidance is to further clarify the quarantine requirements for all persons arriving in Guam. *The following clarification is provided and is applicable to Executive Order 2020-04, 2020-11, 2020-14, 2020-16, 2020-20, 2020-22, 2020-24, 2020-28, 2020-29, 2020-30, 2020-31, 2020-32, 2020-33, and any other Executive Orders regarding entry into Guam and the March 31, 2020, Public Health Directive relative to quarantine of all persons arriving in Guam.*

Based on Executive Order No. 2020-33, travelers to and individuals already in Guam, including residents and non-residents, may be subject to quarantine and isolation pursuant to the laws of Guam.

Therefore, as part of Guam's ongoing effort to contain the spread of COVID-19, all persons entering Guam by air or sea shall be subject to a 14-day quarantine at a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility or approved personal residence or rental lodging.

Individuals permitted to quarantine at their personal residence or rental lodging location must meet criteria as contained in this Guidance document – in these instances, individuals must be tested for COVID-19 and receive a negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam. The Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) will accept two types of diagnostic tests which detect the virus – **molecular** test, such as RT-PCR tests, which detect the virus genetic material, and **antigen** tests, which detect specific proteins on the surface of the virus. These tests help to identify whether people are currently infected with the coronavirus. An antibody (serology) test should not be used to diagnose an active coronavirus infection as antibodies can take several days or weeks to develop after infection and may remain in the blood for several more weeks.

In coordination with the Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA), transiting passengers may be asked to remain in a designated section of the airport facility while awaiting connecting flights less than 13 hours from landing time to departure time. Transiting passengers awaiting connecting flights in excess of 13 hours will quarantine at the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility until they are transported to GIAA to transit off Guam.

All persons are required to fill out a Health Declaration form upon arrival to Guam. Those who are subject to quarantine restrictions are requested to voluntarily comply with the Government of Guam quarantine requirements and indicate their willingness by signing a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form. Persons who choose not to sign or do not agree to voluntarily comply with quarantine will be subject to Involuntary Quarantine and issued a Directive for Temporary Quarantine. Individuals involuntarily quarantined will also be issued a copy of the 10 GCA Chapter 19 Article 6 and Definitions and notified of their right to legal representation.

Costs associated with the quarantine and/or treatment for persons who are **subject to quarantine upon entry into** Guam pursuant to Executive Orders 2020-04, 2020-11, 2020-14, 2020-16, 2020-20, 2020-22, and 2020-24 shall be the responsibility of the individual and the individual's contracted carrier. In addition, all damages to assigned property will be the responsibility of the occupant.

Compliance with voluntary quarantine regardless of location is subject to monitoring, verification, and enforcement. **The knowing and intentional failure to follow any part of this order constitutes a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment of not more than one year or both (10 GCA, Chapter 19, §19604 (c) Cooperation).**

This travel guidance does not apply to individuals identified as contacts to persons with COVID-19. Contacts will be subject to quarantine based on Guam Department of Public Health and Social Service contact investigation and quarantine protocols as well as U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) guidelines, which may extend the quarantine period beyond 14 days.

Arrival Protocols:

A. ARRIVING PASSENGERS:

Arriving passengers (air or sea) are subject to a 14-day quarantine period at a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility, regardless of test results.

By signing a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form, arriving passengers agree to the following:

1. To comply with the voluntary quarantine order for 14 days from date of arrival;
2. To be transported directly from the airport to a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility by the Government of Guam;
3. To remain in their assigned room in a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility;
4. To not receive any visitors or visit any other rooms in the facility;
5. To be monitored daily for symptoms of COVID-19;
6. To leave the quarantine location only for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments.

Individuals departing by air or sea during their quarantine period will be permitted to leave the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable

departure information. Transportation will be provided from the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport for those traveling by air. However, transportation for individuals departing by sea will be the responsibility of the vessel agent.

B. ARRIVING PASSENGERS FROM COUNTRIES WITH NO REPORTED CASES

Arriving passengers (air or sea) with a direct flight or voyage into Guam that originate from a country with No Reported Cases¹ are not required to have a COVID-19 test and are not required to quarantine. However, the following will apply:

1. To observe social distancing, wear protective face coverings, and practice proper hand-washing etiquette;
2. To self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms:
 - a. Chills,
 - b. Shortness of breath,
 - c. Cough, runny nose, sore throat,
 - d. Headache/Muscle aches,
 - e. Fever,
 - f. Loss of smell or taste;
3. To report any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 to their healthcare provider and immediately isolate if they become symptomatic;
4. To be tested for COVID-19 at any private or public clinics if they are symptomatic;
5. To access beaches or parks only for the purpose of individual exercise;
6. To adhere to any Executive Order currently in place for Guam as it pertains to the Public Health Emergency.

C. ESSENTIAL HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS WITH DPHSS ENDORSEMENT LETTER:

Essential Healthcare Professionals (EHP). To qualify for quarantine at a personal residence or rental lodging with Restriction of Movement (ROM) guidelines allowing EHPs to report to work during their quarantine period, EHPs are required to present an endorsement letter from the DPHSS Director at the airport upon arrival and an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam. EHPs without an endorsement letter from the DPHSS Director and an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result will be transported to the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility until they are able to obtain both. DPHSS will facilitate testing at the site as necessary, subject to availability.

The accompanying spouses and dependents of the EHPs arriving on the same flight that present an

acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam must adhere to quarantine requirements at their personal residence or rental lodging, if the EHP is also approved to quarantine at their personal residence or rental lodging.

Spouses and dependents without an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result will be transported to a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility where they will quarantine for a period of 14 days or qualify for home quarantine upon receiving an acceptable negative COVID-19 test result, subject to availability.

In the event the EHP is traveling with dependents who are minors and without a spouse, the minor will be allowed to quarantine alongside the EHP. Minors without a COVID-19 negative test result should receive a COVID-19 test within 72 hours after arrival.

To request an endorsement letter from DPHSS Director authorizing classification as an Essential Healthcare Professional, please visit the DPHSS website at dphss.guam.gov.

Currently there are two types of diagnostic tests accepted by the DPHSS that detect SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19): **molecular** test, such as RT-PCR tests, that detect the virus' genetic material, and **antigen** tests that detect specific proteins on the surface of the virus. These tests help to identify whether people are currently infected with the coronavirus. An antibody (serology) test should not be used to diagnose an active coronavirus infection as antibodies can take several days or weeks to develop after infection and may remain in the blood for several more weeks. In each case, the individual's specimen must have been collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam. At a minimum, test results must include patient name, specimen collection date, and the type of test run.

Essential Healthcare Professionals must adhere to the following requirements:

1. Must sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form.
2. Must provide:
 - a. Quarantine location address
 - b. A working phone number, where they may be contacted
 - c. Name and location where the EHP will be working
 - d. Email address
3. The EHP may leave the quarantine location to: attend work, purchase groceries, exercise individually outdoors, and pick up curbside/drive-through or takeout food services.
4. May leave quarantine location for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments.
5. Must adhere to symptom monitoring before each shift and at least four (4) hours after starting each shift by their healthcare organization's infection control staff.
6. Must report any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 to their healthcare organization's infection control staff, and immediately stop working and isolate if they become symptomatic.
7. May elect to quarantine in a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility alongside spouse and dependents (in the event they are sent to the Government Facility). If electing to do so,

they will not be allowed to leave for work.

Individuals departing by air or sea during their quarantine period will be permitted to leave the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable departure information. Transportation will be provided from the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport for those traveling by air.

D. CRITICAL SERVICES WORKER WITH DPHSS ENDORSEMENT LETTER:

***Critical Services Worker (Mission Essential):* May be considered essential for the functioning of Guam; however, in order to maintain the protection of public health, the following requirements apply:**

Critical Services Worker (CSW). To qualify for quarantine at a personal residence or rental lodging with Restriction of Movement (ROM) guidelines allowing CSWs to report to work during their quarantine period, CSWs are required to present an endorsement letter from the DPHSS Director at the airport upon arrival and an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam. For those without an endorsement letter from the DPHSS Director and an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result, CSWs will be transported to the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility until they are able to obtain both. DPHSS will facilitate testing at the site as necessary, subject to availability.

The accompanying spouses and dependents of the CSWs arriving on the same flight that present an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival to Guam must adhere to quarantine requirements at their personal residence or rental lodging, if the CSW is also approved to quarantine at their personal residence or rental lodging.

Spouses and dependents without an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result will be transported to a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility where they will quarantine for a period of 14 days or qualify for home quarantine upon receiving an acceptable negative COVID-19 test result, subject to availability.

In the event the CSW is traveling with dependents who are minors and without a spouse, the minor will be allowed to quarantine alongside the CSW. Minors without a COVID-19 negative test result should receive a COVID-19 test within 72 hours of arrival.

To request an endorsement letter from DPHSS Director authorizing classification as a Critical Services Worker, please visit the DPHSS website at dphss.guam.gov.

Currently there are two types of DPHSS-acceptable diagnostic tests that detect SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19): **molecular** test, such as RT-PCR tests, that detect the virus' genetic material, and **antigen** tests that detect specific proteins on the surface of the virus. These tests help to identify whether people are currently infected with the coronavirus. An antibody (serology) test should not be used to diagnose an active coronavirus infection as antibodies can take several days or weeks to develop after infection and may remain in the blood for several more weeks. In each case, the individual's specimen must have been collected no more than 5 days prior to arrival on Guam. Test results must include patient name, specimen collection date, and the type of test conducted.

Critical Services Workers must adhere to the following requirements:

1. Must sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form;
2. Must provide:
 - a. Quarantine location address,
 - b. A working phone number, where they may be contacted,
 - c. Name and location where the CSW will be working,
 - d. Email address;
3. The CSW may leave the quarantine location to: attend work, purchase groceries, exercise individually outdoors, and pick up curbside/drive-through or takeout food services;
4. May leave quarantine location for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments;
5. Must adhere to symptom monitoring by the DPHSS;
6. Must report any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 to DPHSS quarantine monitoring staff, and immediately stop working and isolate if they become symptomatic;
7. May elect to quarantine within the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility alongside spouse and dependents (in the event they are sent to the Government Facility). If electing to do so, they will not be allowed to leave for work.

Individuals departing by air or sea during their quarantine period will be permitted to leave the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable departure information. Transportation will be provided from the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport for those traveling by air. However, transportation for individuals departing by sea will be the responsibility of the vessel agent.

E. UNACCOMPANIED MINORS

A **minor** is defined as a person under the age of majority, which legally demarcates childhood from adulthood. The age of majority in Guam is eighteen (18). Therefore, persons below the age of 18 are minors.

An **unaccompanied minor** is defined as a minor who travels into Guam without the presence of a parent, legal guardian, or authorized representative. Upon arrival into Guam, the airline will follow its protocols for Unaccompanied Minor Service. Child Protective Services will be notified for all unaccompanied minors arriving in Guam without a parent, legal guardian, or authorized representative presenting at the airport.

Unaccompanied minors shall complete a 14-day quarantine period at the personal residence or rental lodging identified by the parent, legal guardian, or authorized representative who presents at the airport to assume responsibility for the minor.

Parent, legal guardian, or authorized representative must meet the minor at the airport and provide photo identification in order to receive the minor. The parent, legal guardian, or authorized

representative will be requested to sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form indicating their willingness to comply with the quarantine requirements of the minor.

By signing a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form, the minor's parent, legal guardian or authorized representative agrees to ensure the following:

1. The minor complies with the voluntary quarantine order for 14 days from date of arrival;
2. To have no visitors at the quarantine location;
3. The minor remains at the quarantine location for the duration of quarantine;
4. To permit the minor to be monitored daily for symptoms of COVID-19 by DPHSS;
5. To report any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 observed in the minor to DPHSS quarantine monitoring staff;
6. To allow the minor to leave the quarantine location only for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments.

Individuals with departing flights during their quarantine period will be permitted to transit off Guam prior to the end of the quarantine period.

F. *Airline Crew Members and Federal Aviation Administration Staff - Resident and Non-Resident of Guam* are considered CSWs for the functioning of Guam.

DEFINITIONS:

AIR: Crew member arriving by "Air" is defined as flight crew working on the arriving flights or commuting to work on an upcoming passenger or cargo flights. Crew members must be listed on the "General Declaration" as provided by the Airline *or* pre-listed by DPHSS.

Resident of Guam: Defined as crew members who are residents of Guam.

Non-Resident of Guam: Defined as crew members who do not permanently reside on Guam.

These persons must provide:

1. A valid physical address
2. A working phone number where they can be contacted
3. An email address.

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) staff is defined as FAA employees who travel to Guam for the specific purpose of performing official duties in maintaining critical air transportation services. These persons must be non-residents performing official duties on Guam or residents returning from performing official duty.

Airline Crew/FAA staff - Resident of Guam

1. All crew members and FAA staff are expected to adhere to the general protocols outlined by their employing organization, designed to mitigate COVID-19 transmission.
2. While in Guam, crew members and FAA staff must observe social distancing, wear face coverings and practice proper hand-washing etiquette.

3. Arriving crew members and FAA staff are not required to quarantine or undergo COVID-19 testing
4. Arriving crew members and FAA staff are required to adhere to Executive Order 2020-30
5. All crew members and FAA staff will self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19, and immediately notify their primary healthcare provider if symptoms develop.

Airline Crew/FAA staff – Non-Resident of Guam

1. Crew members and FAA staff shall adhere to the general protocols outlined by their employing Airline, designed to mitigate COVID-19 transmission.
2. Crew members and FAA staff shall sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form.
3. These crew members and FAA staff must self-quarantine within their personal residence or rental lodging.
4. While in Guam, crew members and FAA staff who are commuting or transiting can leave their rental lodging to pick up curbside/drive-through food services, shop for essential groceries, exercise individually outdoors, or access medical care.
 - Non-resident FAA staff may leave their quarantine location to perform all official duties necessary to maintain critical air transportation services for Guam
5. While in Guam, crew members and FAA staff must observe social distancing, wear face coverings and practice proper hand-washing etiquette.
6. All crew members and FAA staff will self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19, and immediately notify their primary healthcare provider if symptoms develop.

G. Vessel Crew Members – Resident and Non-Resident of Guam: for any conveyance, arriving by “air or sea” will self-quarantine at their personal residence or rental lodging location.

Vessel Crew is defined as crew working on the arriving vessel or commuting to work on an upcoming passenger or cargo ocean vessel. Crew members shall adhere to the general protocols outlined by their Maritime employer, designed to mitigate COVID-19 transmission.

Any vessel crew working on DoD vessels are subject to the DoD quarantine guidance. Refer to section J.

To qualify for quarantine at their personal residence or rental lodging, the following criteria must be met:

1. Crew names must be provided to DPHSS 24 hours prior to arrival by an authorized local vessel agent;
2. Agent must be present to provide transportation or have made arrangements with Department of Public Works (DPW) for transport services;

3. Must be arriving on Guam to transit to a scheduled vessel or flight departing Guam within 72 hours.
4. Arrive with an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival, when arriving by air, effective September 25, 2020.

All other vessel crew members not meeting the above criteria will go to the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility.

Vessel Crew must adhere to the following requirements:

1. Must sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form.
2. Must provide:
 - a. Quarantine location address
 - b. A working phone number, where they may be contacted
 - c. Name of Vessel
 - d. Email address
3. Qualifying Vessel Crew members must adhere to the Home Quarantine Restriction of Movement guidelines that will be provided at the point of entry.
4. While in Guam, crew members must observe social distancing, wear face coverings and practice proper hand-washing etiquette.
5. All crew members will self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19, and immediately notify primary care physician if symptoms develop.

Individuals departing by air or sea during their quarantine period will be permitted to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable departure information. Transportation must be arranged by the vessel agent/employer.

H. Medical Referrals:

Many of our neighboring islanders recognize Guam as a destination for quality medical care. Any person arriving to Guam with an urgent medical appointment as documented in a medical referral from an off-island provider will need to submit a request prior to arrival through dphss.guam.gov.

Approval allows these individuals to complete their 14-day quarantine period at their personal residence or rental lodging with a Restriction of Movement (ROM) guideline that allows them to leave their quarantine location to attend their urgent medical appointments. These individuals must present at the airport upon arrival an acceptable COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival on Guam. If test results are not provided, the individual must agree to schedule and receive a COVID-19 test within 24 hours of arrival.

Those who have serious or acute medical conditions, but do not have a medical referral to receive care on Guam, will follow the guidelines in Section I (Emergency Hardship).

In order to access medical care or treatment, Medical Referral Passengers arriving to Guam shall adhere to the following requirements:

1. Sign a *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form;
2. Provide:
 - a. Quarantine location address,
 - b. A working phone number, where passengers can be contacted,
 - c. Email address;
3. Adhere to the home quarantine Restriction of Movement guidelines that will be provided at the airport;
4. Adhere to any Executive Order currently in place for Guam as it pertains to the Public Health Emergency;
5. Individuals with departing flights during their quarantine period will be permitted to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable flight information.

Care Providers and Traveling Companions:

Care providers and traveling companions of medical referral passengers are allowed to home quarantine with ROM. Upon arrival, they must present a valid COVID-19 negative test result collected within 5 days of arrival on Guam. If test results are not provided, the individual must agree to schedule and receive a COVID-19 test within 24 hours of arrival. Care providers and traveling companions will adhere to the same quarantine requirements as the medical referral passengers they are accompanying.

I. Emergency / Hardship:

Any person arriving in Guam with proof of a family emergency, serious acute medical condition, behavioral health condition, or recent medical procedure or surgery must adhere to the following:

1. Persons must go directly from the airport to a Government of Guam Quarantine Facility with the exception of those approved through **Section H. (Medical Referrals)**;
2. Persons must submit proof of the emergency/hardship to Public Health at the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility in order to request for consideration of an emergency or hardship circumstance;
3. Persons will be assessed by the Medical, Behavioral Health, and Public Health staff at the Government of Guam quarantine facility to determine necessary services, which may include an option to leave quarantine on a limited basis for a single event or transfer to home quarantine;
 - a. Individuals must offer documentation and information regarding the emergency/hardship to Medical, Behavioral Health, and Public Health staff
 - b. Reviews for emergency/hardship may take several days depending on the completeness of documentation and availability of COVID-19 testing
4. To be eligible for emergency/hardship consideration, persons must receive a COVID-19 negative test result (post-arrival).

5. Government of Guam Quarantine Facility Medical, Behavioral Health, and Public Health staff will determine whether a person's emergency/hardship situation qualifies for an option to leave quarantine for a time-limited activity or transfer to home quarantine on a case-by-case basis
6. Those who are approved to leave quarantine for a single time-limited event/activity, must agree to the following:
 - a. Return to the Government of Guam quarantine facility at the conclusion of the approved event duration to complete the remainder of their 14-day quarantine;
 - b. Wear personal protective equipment as directed by Public Health staff and adhere to social distancing requirements during the entire activity;
 - c. Be transported to and from the Government of Guam Quarantine facility and supervised by authorized Government of Guam staff (e.g., law enforcement officers, National Guard, other authorized DPHSS or Department of Public Works staff, etc.) during the event;
 - d. Authorized events will typically be approved for two (2) hours in duration.
7. Those who are eligible to quarantine at home must agree to the following:
 - a. Sign a new *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* form;
 - b. Provide:
 - i. Quarantine location address,
 - ii. A working phone number, where they may be contacted, and
 - iii. Email address;
 - c. Not leave the quarantine location except to attend to the emergency/hardship at authorized time or for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments;
 - d. Undergo symptom monitoring by the Department of Public Health and Social Services;
 - e. Return to the Government of Guam quarantine facility if found to be non-adherent to symptom monitoring and/or quarantine.
8. Persons that opt out of testing or are not granted emergency/hardship approval, the original *Voluntary Quarantine Acknowledgement* applies, which means they agree:
 - a. To comply with the voluntary quarantine order for 14 days from date of arrival.
 - b. To remain in the Government of Guam designated quarantine facility in their assigned room.
 - c. To not receive any visitors and not go to any other rooms in the facility.
 - d. To be monitored daily for symptoms of COVID-19.
 - e. To comply with symptom monitoring and tracking for the duration of stay up to 14 days.
 - f. To observe social distancing, wear face coverings and practice proper hand-washing etiquette.
 - g. To leave quarantine location only for medical emergencies and approved medical appointments.

Individuals departing by air or sea during their quarantine period will be permitted to leave the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to transit off Guam if they provide verifiable departure information. Transportation will be provided from the Government of Guam Quarantine Facility to A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport for those traveling by air. However, transportation for individuals departing by sea will be the responsibility of the vessel agent.

J. Active Duty Military and Dependents

Active Duty military and dependents, DoD civilians and dependents, and DoD contractors arriving by commercial air or sea are subject to the following:

1. Active duty, DoD civilians, and DoD contractors who are on the Joint Task Force listing at the point of entry will follow quarantine guidelines and restriction of movement as established by the DoD.
2. Active duty and DoD civilians who are **not** on the Joint Task Force listing at the point of entry will follow the arriving passengers protocols for the general public established in Section A.
