

GUAM ENTRY PROTOCOLS

All incoming travelers into Guam are subject to a ten (10) day quarantine. Travelers arriving into the United States from any foreign country are subject to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) requirement of obtaining a negative pre-departure COVID-19 test result or documentation of recovery from COVID-19, and are still required to undergo quarantine based on their traveler status as defined in DPHSS Guidance Memo 2020-11 Rev. 13 and, are subject to exemptions as in this guidance memo. Further guidance for travelers who may be eligible for exemption from quarantine is as stated:

■ PRE-ARRIVAL NEGATIVE COVID-19 RT-PCR TEST

- Passengers who present a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test may be exempt from quarantine. Passengers seeking exemption from quarantine under this section must present the following at the port of entry upon arrival:
 - Photo identification (e.g., passport, driver's license, state-issued identification);
 - Valid negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result collected within 72 hours prior to arrival into Guam.

RT-PCR tests detect SARS-CoV-2 genetic material. These tests identify individuals who are currently infected with SARS-CoV-2. Test results must include patient name, date of birth, specimen collection date, and the type of COVID-19 test performed.

OTHER PRE-ARRIVAL NEGATIVE COVID-19 VIRAL TEST

- Passengers who do not qualify for exemption from quarantine (i.e. no pre-arrival negative COVID-19 RT-PCR Test or not fully vaccinated) may qualify for quarantine at a rental lodging or personal residence. In order to qualify, passengers must present the following at the airport upon arrival:
 - Photo identification (e.g., passport, driver's license, state-issued identification); AND,
 - Valid negative COVID-19 viral (non-RT-PCR) test result collected within 72 hours prior to arrival into Guam.

Other viral tests, such as LAMP tests or antigen tests, also detect SARS-CoV-2 genetic material or specific proteins on the surface of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. These tests also help to identify whether individuals are currently infected with SARS-CoV-2. Test results must include patient name, date of birth, specimen collection date, and the type of COVID-19 test performed.

DPHSS Guidance Memo 2020-11 Rev. 13 contains arrival protocols, including, but not limited to guidance for travelers with prior COVID-19 infections, arrivals from areas with no (active) cases or imported/sporadic cases, emergency or hardship-related travel to Guam and critical service worker requests. - LAMP: Loop-mediated Isothermal Amplification
- TMA: Transcription Mediated Amplification
- TRC: Transcription Reverse-transcription Concerted reaction
- Smart Amp: Smart Amplification process
- NEAR: Nicking Enzyme Amplification Reaction

- Smartphone requirements***

- OEL (location reporting app)
- Report health condition daily via website (URL provided to traveler via email)
- MySOS (confirm location by video call from Health Monitoring Center for Overseas Entrants)

- Google Maps (location data when positive)
 - Traveler will be required to rent a smartphone if they do not own one

- For Japanese nationals who have negative result in both tests, leave the facility and are requested to self-quarantine at home during the remaining period of 14 days after entering Japan


- Requires a negative PCR test 72 hours prior to departure
- Fill out electronic health declaration form prior to departure via Quarantine System for Entry @ <https://hdhq.mohw.gov.tw>
- Travelers are required to make an affidavit stating that the location of their intended **14-day quarantine** in Taiwan meets relevant regulations
- All travelers will be quarantined for 14 days with the following exceptions:
 - Short-term business with advance permission for shortened quarantine period

TRAVELERS TO KOREA

- All travelers to South Korea must provide proof of a negative PCR test result collected within 72 hours of their departure
- As of May 5, those fully vaccinated in South Korea can bypass quarantine; PCR test required on day 6/7
- Those not fully vaccinated in Korea must undergo 14-day home quarantine; PCR tests required on day 1 and day 12/13
- Korean nationals arriving without a negative PCR test will be required to undergo a 7-day quarantine at a government facility at their expense, followed by 7 days of home quarantine
- Foreigners arriving without a negative PCR test will be denied entry

PHILIPPINES ENTRY MEASURES

NEW PUBLIC ADVISORY REGARDING VISA ISSUANCES 02 August 2021

The Philippine Consulate General in Agana issues the following guidelines to travelers (US passport holders and those with visa-free privileges) to the Philippines effective 01 August 2021:

1. The Consulate may now issue 9(a) temporary visitor visas (single-entry, and valid for use within 90 days) to foreign spouse, parent/s and or children of **Filipino citizens WITHOUT NEED FOR THE ENTRY EXEMPTION DOCUMENT (EED)**, which was previously required. All visas issued for this purpose will have a notation, "EED not required per IATF Resolution No.: 128 (s. 2021)".
2. For general clarity, foreign spouse, parent/s and/or children of Filipino citizens shall refer to the following:
 - Foreign spouses of Filipino nationals, with proof of marriage (Marriage Certificate);
 - Foreign minor (below 18 years of age) children, and foreign children with special needs regardless of age, of Filipino nationals; and
 - Foreign parents of minor Filipino children, and foreign parents of Filipino children with special needs regardless of age.
3. If foreign nationals wish to travel on previously issued (issued before 1 August 2021) but still valid 9(a) visas, that do not contain the new notation, the traveler must still present the Letter to the Bureau of Immigration (LBI) issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs-Manila upon arrival in the country; Alternatively, the same foreign nationals may instead apply for new 9(a) visa to avail themselves of the new privilege (Rule 1).

In the meantime, the following rules shall remain in effect:

4. Mandatory 14-day quarantine for all arriving travelers.

The first 10 days shall be observed in a quarantine facility; with the remainder to be completed either in the hotel quarantine facility or under home quarantine in their respective local government units of destination.

5. Reverse Transcription Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) Test

A test will be done on the seventh day (with Day 1 being the day of arrival). In case of a negative test result, the arriving traveler shall complete the facility-based quarantine period totaling 10 days.

6. US Citizens/Other Citizens traveling under the Medical Referral System (MRS)

The Medical Referral System provider on Guam will handle submission of required documents of patients travelling to the Philippines. A Visa and Entry Exemption Document will be issued by the Consulate to the applicant, through the MRS provider, upon receipt of

the same from the Department of Foreign Affairs-Manila. Further, a quarantine exemption document to be issued by the Philippine Bureau of Quarantine, if needed and applicable, will be handled by the MRS provider.

7. US Citizens/Other Citizens requiring Medical Services but not under the MRS (Personal Filing)

Please secure the full list of documentary requirements from the Consulate by sending an email indicating full name and number to pcqagana@gmail.com.

The request for entry exemption and 9a visa may be referred to the designated email address of the Department of Health-Manila.

Based on IATF-EID Resolution No. 97, **28 January 2021**
Effective **01 February**, **only foreign nationals allowed under relevant IATF resolutions** will be permitted entry to the PH, subject to the following rules:



1. Hold a **valid visa at the time of entry**, except those qualified under the **Balikkbayan Program** (Sec. 3.c. in RA6768)



2. Have a **pre-booked accommodation** for at least seven (7) nights in an accredited quarantine hotel/facility



3. Undertake **COVID-19 testing** at the quarantine hotel/facility **on the 6th day from the date of arrival**



4. Be within the **maximum capacity of inbound passengers** at the port and date of entry

HIGHLIGHTS NATIONWIDE

- The state of emergency in Tokyo and Okinawa has also been extended until August 31 along with Chiba, Kanagawa and Saitama, Osaka.
- The nationwide number of new daily cases soared past 10,000 for the first time on July 29.
- Tokyo government reported the daily new cases has exceeded 3,000 for the third consecutive day since July 28.
- 4,058 new cases, which is record high in Tokyo has been reported on July 31.



EXTENSION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY:

- Restaurants and other establishments that serve alcohol will be close.
- Restaurants that do not serve alcohol will be asked to close by 8:00 p.m.
- Department stores and large facilities will be asked to open until 8 p.m.
- Events will be limited to either 50% of the venue's capacity or 5,000 people, whichever is less.
- Firms aim to encourage employees to work from home, reducing the number of commuters by 70% .
- Refrain from non-essential travel between prefectures

JAPAN TOKYO OLYMPICS NEWS

UPDATE

- The Tokyo Olympic opening ceremony has kicked off for the world's biggest sporting event on July 23.
- More than 11,000 athletes from about 200 countries and territories came to Japan to compete in a record 33 sports.
- The Tokyo Games are taking place under unusual circumstances with no fans in attendance.
- Tokyo is under its fourth COVID-prompted state of emergency as cases continue to surge in the capital city.
- The opening Ceremony to Tokyo Games featured a rather different and memorable performance known as the 'pictogram sequence' which is pantomimes depicting the 50 Olympic sport pictograms.
- As of now, China has won 23 gold medals, followed by the United States with 20, and Japan with 17.

BORDER CONTROL MEASURES

QUARANTINE RULES UPDATE

ENTRY FROM GUAM

- Documentation requirements:
 - COVID-19 negative test record (certificate).
 - Negative certificate must include COVID-19 test methods, sample collection, test results, date of test, and sample collection date.
- Upon arrival in Japan
 - Take COVID-19 test (antigen test), if test result is negative,
 - Submit to COVID-19 test.
 - Sign a special pledge.
 - Download the following apps on mobile phone: OEL, MySOS, Google Maps, COCOA.
- Quarantine rules:
 - All arrivals, regardless of nationality and regardless of whether they have been vaccinated or not, are subject to a 14-day quarantine.
 - Self-quarantine for 14 days at personal residence or in a hotel.
 - During 14-day quarantine period, public transportation will not be allowed to use.
 - The public transportation from the airport to your home or hotel upon arrival is not permitted to use.
- Pre-arrival requirements:
 - Obtain a negative COVID-19 test result within 72 hours of departure for Japan.
 - COVID-19 test method: RT- PCR, LAMP, TMA, TRC, Smart Amp, NEAR, Next generation sequence, Quantitative antigen test (CLEIA/ECLEIA)
 - Sample collection Nasopharyngeal Swab, Saliva, Nasopharyngeal and oropharyngeal swabs.





IATA RECOMMENDATION: HIGH COST OF PCR TEST

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) has again called on the individual national governments to implement more measures to reduce the cost of Covid-19 testing.

Details of IATA request:

Flexibility to allow the use of cost effective antigen tests instead of expensive PCR tests".

IATA'S MOST RECENT TRAVELER SURVEY:

- 86% of respondents are willing to get tested.
- 70% also believe that the cost of testing is a significant barrier to travel.
- 78% believe governments should bear the cost of mandatory testing.

IATA COMMENTS:

- Restarting international travel is vital to supporting the 46 million travel and tourism jobs around the world that rely on aviation.
- Willie Walsh IATA's Director General, said

"Our latest survey confirms that the high cost of testing will bear heavily on the shape of the travel recovery. It makes little sense for governments to take steps to reopen borders, if those steps make the cost of travel prohibitive to most people. We need a restart that is affordable for all,"





1.3M DOSES OF MODERNA VACCINE TO ARRIVE IN S. KOREA THIS WEEK



- South Korea will receive 1.3 million doses of the Moderna vaccine on August 6 or 7, as the government is preparing to expand the COVID-19 vaccine shots to those aged under 50.
- Consultations with the U.S. pharmaceutical company have been finalized for the shipment amid the public doubt of the vaccine supply.



UNVACCINATED PEOPLE AGED 60-74 CAN RESERVE VACCINE FROM AUGUST 2

- People aged 60-74 who did not receive vaccination during the first half of the year can reserve the vaccine schedule from 8 p.m. on August 2.



- 600,000 senior citizens aged 75 and older who have not yet been vaccinated can reschedule their vaccination and get a Pfizer vaccine at any time.



17 MILLION PEOPLE AGED 18-49 TO RECEIVE COVID-19 SHOTS STARTING IN MID-AUGUST



- South Korea would make vaccinations available to 17.8 million people aged between 18 and 49 in August and September, with the aim of administering first shots to a total of at least 36 million people by the end of September.
- Those whose occupations involve frequent contact with children and those who serve in the public transportation, logistics and sanitation sectors will be the first in line, and can be inoculated as early as Aug. 17.

WORLD BANK, COVAX UNVEIL PLAN TO SPEED VACCINE SUPPLIES

- COVAX and the World Bank will accelerate COVID-19 vaccine supply for developing countries through a new financing mechanism.
- COVAX will be able to make advance purchases from vaccine manufacturers based on aggregated demand across countries, using financing from the World Bank and other multilateral development banks



JAPAN TO EXPAND STATE OF EMERGENCY

- Japan's government on proposed states of emergency through August 31 as COVID-19 cases spike to records around the country.
- Daily cases in Japan topped 10,000 for the first time on July 29.



CDC REVERSES INDOOR MASK POLICY

- CDC changed some masking guidelines, recommending that even vaccinated people return to wearing masks indoors in parts of the U.S. where the delta variant of the coronavirus is fueling infection surges.







COVID-19 VACCINE DONATED BY LITHUANIA ARRIVES IN TAIWAN

A total of 20,000 doses of the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine donated by Lithuania arrived in Taiwan on Saturday morning, with the donation being seen by some as a symbol of closer ties between the two countries.



Turkish Airlines TK6210 flight, carrying the vaccine, touched down at the Taoyuan International Airport at 10:33 a.m. Soon after the arrival, the vaccine doses were transported under tight security to the designated cold chain warehouse and sealed for inspections before they can be administered.

On June 22, Lithuania pledged the donation saying the 20,000 doses of AstraZeneca would be delivered by late September, but the delivery came ahead of schedule at a time of a vaccine shortage in Taiwan.

Foreign Minister Joseph Wu (吳釗燮) announced Taiwan will open a representative office in Lithuania to expand its relations with the Baltic state and other Central European countries. It will be the first time in 18 years that Taiwan has opened a new representative office in Europe. The last location to be established there was the Taipei Representative Office in Slovakia, in 2003. However, it is not clear when the new mission will open in Lithuania.

DELTA VARIANT IDENTIFIED IN SEVEN MORE IMPORTED COVID-19 CASES

- The more infectious Delta variant of the coronavirus was recently identified in seven COVID-19 patients who entered Taiwan in July, a health official said Friday.
- Genome sequencing of the coronavirus successfully done in eight people who contracted the disease abroad found that seven had the Delta variant and one the Alpha variant, said Lo Yi-chun (羅一鈞), a deputy director-general of the Centers for Disease Control, at the daily government COVID-19 press briefing.
- The results reflected the threat posed by the Delta variant, which is behind the recent surge of COVID-19 cases in several countries, and the need to maintain strict border controls, Lo said.
- To date, Taiwan has recorded 42 people infected with the Delta variant -- 30 who contracted the disease overseas and 12 who contracted the virus locally -- according to Central Epidemic Command Center data.

TAIWAN INCLUDES MORE FOREIGN NATIONALS IN VACCINATION PROGRAM

- Taiwan on Thursday expanded its nationwide COVID-19 vaccination program to include foreign nationals who are legally in Taiwan but do not have either a residence permit or a national health insurance (NHI) card.
- At a regular press briefing, Health Minister Chen Shih-chung (陳時中) said adult foreign nationals who had not been able to register before on the government website for vaccination because they did not have the required documents, can now do so, using their travel documents.
- In the current round of bookings, which opened Tuesday and closes at noon on Aug. 2, foreign nationals 18 years old and over can register by entering their passport number and a temporary "UI" that can be issued by the National Immigration Agency (NIA) for that purpose, Chen said.
- Prior to Thursday, foreign nationals registering on the government system for COVID-19 vaccination were required to enter both their residence permit and national health insurance (NHI) card numbers on the website.
- With the expansion of the vaccination program, however, foreign nationals who do not have an NHI card can use their residence permit and passport numbers, said Chen, who heads the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC).



APPOINTMENTS OPEN IN TAIWAN FOR 2ND MODERNA SHOTS

- People in Taiwan can now book an online appointment for their second dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, as the government resumed online appointments Tuesday, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) said Wednesday.
- The online system was reopened 2 p.m. Tuesday to people 18 years old and over, after new registration for COVID-19 jabs was temporarily halted on July 19, the CECC said.
- In the latest round of registrations, people who have received their first dose of the Moderna vaccine can schedule an appointment for their second shot of the same brand, said Minister of Health and Welfare Chen Shih-chung (陳時中), who heads the CECC.
- Due to a tight supply of the Moderna vaccine, however, only people in the CECC's top three priority groups are currently eligible to receive a second shot of that brand 28 days after the first one, he said.
- The priority groups include medical personnel, flight crews, employees in other COVID-19 high-risk jobs, and pregnant women, according to the CECC.

ROLLOUT OF DOMESTIC COVID-19 VACCINE LIKELY BY AUGUST



- A domestic COVID-19 vaccine that has been included as an option on the government's online vaccination appointment system is expected to be available by August, Minister of Health and Welfare Chen Shih-chung (陳時中) said Wednesday.
- Chen made the remarks at a press briefing, after President Tsai Ing-wen (蔡英文) said earlier in the day that she had registered to get the COVID-19 vaccine developed by Taiwan-based Medigen Vaccine Biologics Corp.
- Chen announced on July 19 that the Taiwan Food and Drug Administration (FDA) had granted emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Medigen vaccine to begin mass production.



- Meanwhile, Vice President Lai Ching-te (賴清德) is planning to get a COVID-19 vaccine developed by another Taiwanese manufacturer, United Biomedical Inc. Asia, once it receives EUA from the Taiwan FDA, according to Chen.

PHILIPPINES RECEIVES 3 MILLION US-DONATED MODERNA DOSES

The Philippines received another 3 million Moderna vaccine doses donated by the United States government on Tuesday, August 3, as health officials sought a greater supply of vaccines in the race to contain the spread of the highly-transmissible COVID-19 Delta variant.

The delivery of 3,000,060 Moderna doses follows the US' earlier donation of 3.2 million doses of Johnson & Johnson single-shot vaccine, which arrived in the country mid-July. The arrival of Moderna doses brings the total number of vaccines donated by the US to some 6 million doses - the largest donation so far from a single country to the Philippines.

President Rodrigo Duterte had welcomed the arrival of the vaccines at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport shortly past 4 pm, a first for the Philippine leader who had graced the arrival of vaccine donations from different countries, but not the US.



PHILIPPINES TO EXTEND NIGHT CURFEW IN MANILA TO LIMIT POTENTIAL COVID-19 SURGE

The Philippines will extend a night curfew in Manila amid a tightening of restrictions to combat a potential surge in cases of the Delta variant of the coronavirus, a government official said recently.

Metropolitan Manila, already subject to a six hour curfew from 10:00 p.m. (1400 GMT), will bring forward that curfew by two hours to 8:00 p.m. (1200 GMT), said Benjamin Abalos, chair of the region's governing body.



"This will stop the virus for the meantime. What's important is our hospitals don't get full," Abalos told a briefing.

FIRST-EVER OLYMPIC GOLD LIFTS COVID-WEARY PHILIPPINES



The Philippines's Hidilyn Diaz has won the women's 55-kilogramme (121-pound) category for weightlifting at Tokyo 2020 to become the country's first Olympic gold medallist, igniting celebrations back home among the COVID-19 pandemic-weary population.

Competing in her fourth Olympics, the 30-year-old lifted 97kg (213.84 lbs) in the snatch and an Olympic record of 127kg (279.98 lbs) in the clean and jerk for a total of 224kg (493.8 lbs), also an Olympic record.

DUTERTE RESTORES PHILIPPINES'S KEY MILITARY AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES

Visiting Forces Agreement, which the Philippine president had planned to cancel, is a key part of the relationship between the two nations.



President Rodrigo Duterte has restored a pact governing the presence of US troops in the Philippines, the two countries' defence secretaries announced on Friday, retracting a decision that had caused increasing concern among policymakers in Washington and Manila.

LIST OF 'GREEN COUNTRIES' OR TERRITORIES REVISED

The COVID-19 task force has reduced the number of "green countries" from where fully vaccinated travelers qualify for a shorter quarantine period upon arrival in the Philippines. Thirteen jurisdictions were removed and seven areas were added to the list of green countries, as shown in a new list provided by the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases.

The following areas were removed: Barbados, the British Virgin Islands, Eswatini, French Polynesia, Greenland, Iceland, Isle of Man, Israel, Liechtenstein, Malta, Mauritius, South Korea, and Vietnam. The IATF added the following jurisdictions to the list of green countries: Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Djibouti, Hungary, Kosovo, Moldova, and Slovakia.

Under IATF's guidelines, inbound fully vaccinated travelers coming from green countries will undergo a seven-day facility-based quarantine, instead of 10 days.


