SCHOOL MEAL DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM EXPANDS TO INCLUDE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH

The Guam Department of Education (GDOE) is expanding its School Meal Distribution Program to include both breakfast and lunch beginning Friday, November 13, 2020. The program first launched in September and is available to all children 18 years of age and below and will include students attending public, private and charter schools.

The school meals program will provide one bundle of five days worth of nonperishable breakfast and lunch items per child, and will be distributed at no cost utilizing a drive-through operation, on a first come, first served basis. The school meal program is limited to one set of meals per child. Vehicles are limited to a maximum of 5 food bundles, and walkers are limited to a maximum of 5 food bundles. Meals are limited in availability and should be picked up at a school within a child's attendance area.

The school meal distribution program is available at all GDOE schools, and the distribution program is operational every Friday only, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., except holidays. Walkers are also accepted. The GDOE is working to offer this school meal program to ensure students continue to receive nutritious meals throughout the ongoing school closure due to COVID-19.

The school meal distribution program is made possible through a waiver received by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Participants are asked to wear a mask when picking up meals through a drive-through system. GDOE staff will be on hand to facilitate the school meal distribution. Drivers should remain in their vehicles and follow instructions to facilitate a smooth and safe distribution process. Walkers must also wear masks.

GUAM DEPARTMENT OF LABOR BATCHES \$9.9 MILLION FOR PUA

Another 9.9 million will hit bank accounts and mailboxes late this week or early next week. The Guam Department of Labor ran its most recent Pandemic Unemployment Assistant batch for cleared claims through Sept. 10. Of the \$9.9 million, \$7.9 million will be in direct deposits, \$1.2 million will be in paper checks and about \$802,000 will be in federal withholding taxes.

"I'm glad that we were able to get this money out which brings us to almost \$425 million in total unemployment benefits and taxes paid. My priority has always been to continue to get the money out and I'm happy we were able to get out this week's batch successfully," said Department of Labor Director David Dell'Isola.

The Department will continue to draw down funds from the federal government as claims are scrubbed and cleared.

1 COVID-19 News

- There is increasing concern about the spread of infections towards the winter season

- Tokyo continues to see new confirmed cases, with 63% of the transmissions within the household and workplace

- StarLux Airlines has applied with the Civil Aeronautics Administration (CAA) for rights to fly to 15 American destinations, which include Guam
- Outbound travel from Taiwan is unlikely to resume before the end of 2021 said Health and Welfare Minister Chen Shih-chung
- More than half of Taiwan's travel agencies could face bankruptcy if travel bubbles with other Asian countries wait until 2022

SOUTH KOREA

1 COVID-19 News

- New cases rose by triple digits for the second day on Nov 9, with a series of cluster infections being reported from markets and family gatherings
- More sporadic cluster infections are found at risk-prone facilities, such as nursing homes and private gatherings
- Health authorities warned that Level 1.5 scheme can be applied nationwide if the daily virus curve does not flatten soon
- Health authorities announced that any passengers bound for China from South Korea using regular flights are required to take two PCR tests for the coronavirus within 48 hours before their departure






NATIONWIDE: NEW CASES

HIGHLIGHT TOKYO

- 294 new cases were confirmed in Tokyo on November 7th, over 200 for the 3rd consecutive day.
- Push for better practices on basic infection prevention measures such as frequent ventilation and wearing a mask etc.
- The transmission at the household and workplace account for 63% of all new cases in Tokyo.
- Untraceable cases account for 57% for the past week.
- The government is calling on the citizens to take extra caution in the coming winter season.





MOFA Japan has allowed short-term business and official travel from Singapore, South Korea and Vietnam.


BUSINESS TRACK WITH THREE COUNTRIES

- Singapore (since September 18)
- South Korea (since October 8)
- Vietnam (since November 1)



- Allow cross-border travelers to enter Japan or its counterpart country
- Short-term business travelers (example: Japan-Singapore: less than 30 days)
- Obtaining a certificate of pre-entry test result before entry
- Require to take PCR or Antigen test upon arrival at the airport in Japan
- Allow limited business activity during the 14-days, but need to submit of Schedule of Activities in Japan
- Retaining location data for 14-days after entering to Japan
- Refraining from using public transportation




Yoshihide Suga and Nguyen Xuan Phuc address reporters after agreeing to expand their border reopenings for business travelers

SOUTH KOREA

HIGHLIGHT

- South Korea's new coronavirus cases rose by triple digits for the second day on November 9, with a series of cluster infections being reported from venues of everyday life, ranging from markets to family gatherings.
- South Korea has been striving to curb COVID-19 from hospitals and nursing homes, recently saw more sporadic cluster infections at risk-prone facilities, such as nursing homes and private gatherings.
- Health authorities warned that the Level 1.5 scheme can be applied nationwide if the daily virus curve does not flatten soon.
- The country adopted the lowest level of its social distancing scheme under revised five-tier infection preventive measures. The country previously operated a three-tier system.

PASSENGERS TO CHINA MUST HAVE TWO NEGATIVE PCR TESTS BEFORE BOARDING

Regular flights: take PCR test twice within 48 hours of boarding...at least three hours' interval

Irregular flights: second test shall be carried out within 36 hours after the first test within 72 hours.

Health authorities announced that any passengers bound for China from South Korea using regular flights are required to take two polymerase chain reaction tests for the coronavirus within 48 hours before their departure.

The passengers need to pay for the two tests, which should be conducted more than three hours apart in different hospitals designated by the Chinese Embassy in Seoul.

The mandatory tests are set to begin November 11.

China has strengthened quarantine measures against all arrivals from foreign countries over a resurgence of COVID-19 cases in foreign countries, according to the health authorities.





AVIATION INDUSTRY RECRUITED A TASK FORCE TEAM

JIN AIR IS THE FIRST KOREAN LCCS TO DELIVER CARGO TO US



- Jin Air has begun flying cargo to the United States as part of efforts to survive the COVID-19 pandemic, and Jin Air is the first Korean LCCs to deliver cargo to US.
- On November 1, Jin Air flew its B777-200ER passenger jet from Incheon to Los Angeles, carrying 23 tons of displays and other electronic components in its belly cargo space.

KOREAN LCCS RETURN AIRCRAFT DUE TO COVID-19 CRISIS



- Korean LCCs are minimizing their aircrafts. According to Airport Portal System, Korean LCCs returned total 15 aircrafts amid prolonged COVID-19 crisis.
- Jeju Air terminated one B737-800 aircraft lease contract last month, Jin air returned two B737-800 aircrafts in July.
- T'way returned one B737-800 aircraft, Air Busan returned three A321-200 aircrafts, and Eastar Jet returned eight aircrafts because their Air Operator Certificate is terminated.

- Jin Air is also launching Skyline Tour Product with Hong Kong theme co-op with Klook on November 14. The flight will depart for Gwangju, Jeju Island, Busan and Daegu for almost 2 hours and return to Incheon International Airport. During the virtual tour, passengers will be given souvenirs related to Hong Kong.
- The product includes virtual tour ticket and early bird Hong Kong round trip ticket which is valid until March 2022.
- Also, Klook is providing Hong Kong travel voucher which can be used for hotel, rental car, and optional tours, etc.

TAIWAN'S STARLUX AIRLINES APPLIES FOR 15 AMERICAN FLIGHT ROUTES

Taiwan's StarLux Airlines said on Sunday (Nov. 8) that the carrier has applied with the Civil Aeronautics Administration (CAA) for the rights to fly to 15 American destinations.

StarLux President Glenn Chai confirmed the flight route applications, according to a. When the airline will begin to operate each route will depend on market conditions and the delivery of the aircraft StarLux has ordered. He expects to begin operating the U.S. routes in 2022.

Chai confirmed that StarLux has applied to the CAA for routes to Los Angeles, San Francisco, Seattle, San Jose, Ontario, New York's JFK and Newark airports, Washington D.C., Houston, Chicago, Dallas, Miami, Boston, Honolulu, and **Guam**.



OUTBOUND TRAVEL LIKELY TO RESUME IN LATE 2021: TAIWAN HEALTH MINISTER

Outbound travel from Taiwan is unlikely to resume before the end of 2021, as the world is facing a resurgence of the Wuhan coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, Health and Welfare Minister Chen Shih-chung said on television Friday (Nov. 7).



In the meantime, “business travel bubbles” could be introduced if the Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA) deems it necessary for business travelers to arrive from overseas and if the travelers’ employers are able to arrange safe itineraries during their stay in Taiwan, according to Chen.

HALF OF TAIWAN'S TRAVEL AGENCIES FACE RUIN IF TRAVEL BUBBLES WAIT UNTIL 2022

If travel bubbles with other Asian countries wait until 2022, more than half of Taiwan’s travel agencies could face bankruptcy.

With academics and experts now advising Taiwan to keep focusing on domestic travel all through 2021, the travel sector fears 2022 is too far away to save over half the country’s 3,900 travel agencies, Commercial Times reported Monday (Nov. 2).
